He is survived by his beloved wife Pamela Brewell, originally of Cheam, Surrey England. They were married in Christ Church, Sutton England in September of 1954. With members of both families still residing in England, they enjoyed frequent trips to Europe. Don is also survived by daughter Tracy, also of Newark; his son Chris and daughter-in-law Julie of Raleigh, NC; as well as many nieces and nephews. His siblings Mort, George, Bob and Doris predeceased him.
