Scottish Rite Core Values

Illustrious Brother Brittingham was coroneted a Sovereign Grand Inspector General, Honorary member of the Supreme Council on August 27, 1996 in Boston. Jim is also a member of all the York Rite Bodies and served Daylight Chapter Number 10 as High Priest in 1999. Unknown to many, Brother Brittingham was also Grand Master in 1974 - 1975. No, not of the Grand Lodge of Delaware but of the Odd Fellows. He is a member of Eden Lodge Number 34 where he was Degree Master for thirty-two years..
