Jesus Christ Superstar! A DCT Adult Actors Wing Fundraising Event

...an ardent rock opera for all generations, depicting the last week of the life of Jesus Christ.

Jesus Christ Superstar is a rock opera by Andrew Lloyd Webber, with lyrics by Tim Rice. First staged on Broadway in 1971, it highlights political and interpersonal struggles between Judas Iscariot and Jesus. The opera is based loosely on the Gospels' account of the last week of Jesus' life, beginning with the preparation for the arrival of Jesus and his disciples in Jerusalem, and ending with the Crucifixion.

The work's depiction offers a free interpretation of the psychology of Jesus and the other characters. A large part of the plot focuses on the character of Judas, who is depicted as a tragic figure who is dissatisfied with the direction Jesus steers his disciples. Twentieth-century attitudes as well as contemporary slang pervade the lyrics, and ironic allusions to modern life are scattered throughout the depiction of political events.
