promises and resolutions, and treat every day like it's the beginning of a New Year.





#### FORT McHENRY

(History for our Scottish Rite Trip)


When I found out that this year's trip will be to Fort McHenry, I started to look into the history and origins of the Fort. One interesting facet turned out to be why it was named Fort McHenry. Fort McHenry was named after James McHenry, a signer of the Constitution of the United States and a Brother Mason. Born November 16, 1753, he was a Scots-Irish immigrant who came to the Colonies in 1771. He was a surgeon and soldier.

He studied at Newark Academy in Delaware (in 1834 it merged with Newark College to become what is now known as the University of Delaware per the historical marker to the right) and apprenticed under Dr. Benjamin Rush.

During the Revolutionary War, he served as Surgeon in the 5th Pennsyl-

vania Battalion and later Major and Aide-de-Camp to General Lafayette. He held the cabinet post of Secretary of War under Presidents Washington and John Adams.

Information from the Grand Lodge of Maryland states that he was a member of Spiritual Lodge No. 23, Maryland, receiving his E.A. Degree May 21, 1806; F.C. June 18, 1806; M.M. July 30, 1806.



He died May 3, 1816 at his estate ("Fayetteville") near Baltimore and is buried in Westminster Presbyterian Church-yard.

The Jewel is a Teutonic cross of heavily goldplated metal on which rests a double-headed eagle — half black and half white.

#### JEWLS OF THE SCOTTISH RITE



#### LODGE OF PERFECTION (left)

Within the circle is the jewel of the Lodge of Perfection (4th—14th Degrees). The Jewel is a crowned compasses on a segment of a circle; on the segment are engraved 3, 5, 7, 9; in the center is a golden sun with nine points; on the reverse of the center is a blazing star of five points, engraved with the Enochian characters.

#### **COUNCIL PRINCES OF JERUSALEM (right)**

The Jewel is a diamond-shaped mother-of-pearl having encrusted upon it, in gold and silver, a balance in equipoise, on either side of which are "D" and "Z" — beneath the center of the scale a dagger — with the point up — and Five stars surrounding the point — the uppermost one larger than the other four.

### CHAPTER OF ROSE CROIX (left) The Javal is a grouped compaged out



The Jewel is a crowned compasses extended to an angle of 45° resting upon a quadrant; between the legs of the compasses is a cross resting on the quadrant of a circle; its center on one side is occupied by a full-blown rose whose stem twines around the lower limb of the cross; at the foot of the cross covering the lower part of it and ex-

tending between the legs of the compasses is a pelican piercing her breast with her bill to feed with her own blood her young, seven in number, in a nest under it. On the reverse side is an eagle with expanded wings. On one side of the quadrant is the hieroglyphical characteristic of the Knight, and on the other the password in cipher. The eagle, pelican and rose are of silver, the rest of the Jewel of gold. (*continued on page 3, column 2*)
